UPDATE ON RELAUNCH

A Congregational Survey just went out via email to households who have regularly attended in the 2019-2020 school year on July 30. Those who do not have email are being called directly. **The survey deadline is Sunday, August 9**. After that date, the survey will be closed and data analyzed and presented to ReLaunch on Thursday, August 13. The hope is that we can then make more concrete plans from that point forward.

You can help. Along with the preschool, the church will need hand sanitizer, Clorox wipes, D Batteries (hand soap dispensers), and masks. Since these things are limited as to the amount people can purchase, your help in getting these items for the church, and its ministries, will be a huge help.

You can volunteer. This is the most crucial part to the ReLaunch—is persons stepping up to make the environment as safe as possible. Can you help by ushering, by cleaning off places after worship, by greeting people at the door? You can also help with recording the service, contacting persons who we have not seen in awhile, welcoming those who come for the first time, and so on.

In the meantime, ReLaunch has approved the use of the pavilion for small groups to meet. Group leaders will need to contact Pam Moore at the church office to set up times and have a written plan ready as to how they will manage their safety.
