

### DO YOU KNOW?

QUESTION: Who established the first permanent organization of the Evangelical Association in Greensburg? (answer will be in the March 2020 newsletter)

QUESTION from January Newsletter: How did Conrad Dillman and his family help the Evangelical Church prosper in Greensburg?

ANSWER: Conrad Dillman was converted by Jacob Albright. Jacob's home had been a preaching place in Center County, Pennsylvania. Conrad and his wife Christine both became members about 1810. In 1813, they migrated to Ohio and settled one and onehalf miles northwest of the corner which is now called Massillon and Greensburg Road. Dillman was deeply concerned about his fellow settlers, because they were deprived of a religious worship service. So with Bible in hand, on his horse, he went from cabin to cabin, teaching, exhorting, and praying with the people in their new and primitive surroundings. In 1816, Adam Henney, the first Evangelical minister in Ohio, came to Greensburg by way of the circuit and the Dillman log house became a most welcome headquarters for him and his successors. Dillman's zeal for the gospel of Christ and the consecration of his home as a shelter for the circuit preachers and place of worship created an Evangelical fellowship of great reputation.
