Together, we explored practices of silence, solitude, scriptural study, embodied prayer, and personal reflection. I hope that you were inspired to pursue your spiritual disciplines with renewed passion and to draw closer to God. This month, we start a new adventure: Lent. Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day and begins our journey toward Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

This Lent, I invite you to look at Holy Week with fresh eyes. As a guide, I'm turning to the book Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week. Don't let the name fool you, the book is not just for beginners and is insightful for those who have observed Lent for years. The work offers a different cultural perspective on these well-known events.

The author, Amy-Jill Levine, is a Jewish scholar who specializes in the writings of the early Christian church. An alumna of Vanderbilt and Duke, she is currently a Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Hartford International University for Religion and Peace. She has also held office in the Society of Biblical Literature. In recent years, she has published a series of books with the United Methodist publishing house, the Abingdon Press.

Dr. Levine brings a deep awareness of Jewish historical and cultural context to the study of the early church. She helps Christian audiences discover subtle nuances in the text lost in translation from language to language, culture to culture, and time to time. When it comes to Holy Week, we've heard the story so many times, it has been normalized in our minds. In Entering the Passion, Levine shows just how radical some of Jesus' decisions really were.

The Abingdon Press explains, "Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes, or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and re-read these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges." To learn more, join me for our Lenten events.

Each Sunday, my sermon will address the scriptures and ideas raised in one of the chapters of Levine's book. As always, you are welcome to join the Sunday conversation circle in between our two services to unpack your own ideas about this text. In addition, I plan to lead a small group study on the book. We'll meet on Thursdays from February 15 to March 21st at noon for a brown bag lunch and discussion. Even if you can't join one of the discussion groups, I encourage you to grab a copy of the book and read along. When, at the end of Lent, we reach Holy Week, I'm sure you will appreciate it all the more with this added perspective and time for reflection. Above all, may you have a blessed and holy Lent!
