Of Mercy and Mice

Sometimes, a piece of scripture will jump out you from your subconscious. It happened to me the other day. I was at the Nimisila Reservoir releasing two mice into the wild. I opened the traps and gave their sides a little tap to encourage the recalcitrant occupants to make their way out, and from deep in the recesses of my mind leapt forth, "A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out." It was, I think, a reminder that God is gentle.

The children had just finished up their stint as little menacing mice in the Akron University production of the Nutcracker when Madeline spotted something scurrying across our kitchen floor. We weren't sure, but a light dusting of snow on the porch revealed tiny footprints that led toward the house and disappeared. The mouse hunt had begun. I thought about buying traditional mousetraps, but I wondered if there were options for humane traps. I looked online and found one that was highly rated and only slightly more expensive. As instructed, I baited them with a little peanut butter and waited.

The kids were incredibly curious. We talked about live traps versus kill traps. I explained to them that we cannot have mice in the house and I am determined to be rid of them one way or the other. If the humane traps didn't work, I would try the others. I explained that, when possible, I prefer to be gentle, but life doesn't always give you that option.

The scriptures are not very gentle to mice. Leviticus II declares them to be an unclean creature. Isaiah 66 says that anyone who eats them will be cut off. In I Samuel, golden mice are part of the guilt offering when the Philistines return to the Ark of the Covenant. They are unclean and they are a sign of sin. Although, I imagine the little things are rather grateful that we aren't allowed to eat them.

We were all pleased when we had our first catch – two in one night! We tried not terrify the poor creatures. I put the trap in a box until I could run them out to the park. I did indulge the children with a little peek. Four blue eyes staring down at four little black eyes staring up. We pitied them, and I was glad to release them. That's when the scripture came into my mind.

It's from Isaiah, and it's quoted in Matthew. The scriptures say the Lord's chosen will do justice, but they also say he will be gentle with the bruised, the broken, and the burnt out. In some ways we're a little like mice. We are often unclean in the way we live toward God and neighbor. You aren't supposed to eat people, but in a way we sometimes do – harming each other, taking from each other. Yet, God chose to be merciful with us. That may be why it feels good to be merciful to these little mice. Practice what you preach and give of what you have received. It reminds me of a poem by Rudy Francisco, from his collection Helium. Rudy writes:

"She asks me to kill the spider. Instead, I get the most peaceful weapons I can find.

I take a cup and a napkin. I catch the spider, put it outside and allow it to walk away.

If I am ever caught in the wrong place at the wrong time, just being alive and not bothering anyone,

I hope I am greeted with the same kind of mercy."

I know I already have.

NICU staff, babies, and families alike benefit from this generous offering. The coverlets are used to block out the lights over the isolettes where the small premature babies sleep and grow. We also make sheets for the isolette and crib mattresses. When working in the NICU, I often see the blankets, coverlets, and sheets that GUMC has given for this mission!

We are asking for participation on Saturday, February 4th from 9am to noon, for fabric to be used to create blankets and

coverlets, or monetary donations for this mission project. It is important to note that you do not have to be a seamstress or tailor to join in the fun! The blankets are for Akron Children's Newborn Intensive Care and will be dropped off to the NICU on February 11th. Please note the size of the fabric we need for the project.

The needs are as follows: <u>Coverlets/Blankets</u> – 1 ¹/₄ Yards, at least 45 inch wide <u>Cotton, Fleece or Flannel Blankets</u> – 1 ¹/₂ Yards (avg width is 59") <u>Fleece</u> – 2 ¹/₂ Yards (avg width is 59") (prewashed fabric donations would be appreciated)
