# **FROM YOUR PASTOR**

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

This verse has served as a voice of comfort many times for many people, especially people who perceive themselves in the wilderness, much like our time now: the wilderness of the unknown, of mental struggle, of homes on edge, of human trafficking, of racial, social, economic, gender injustices even in the midst of world illness.

Yes, Lord-come do a new thing!

There is also the other side of that reality. Wilderness walking also pulls people back to the comfort of the ways things used to be. How many times was Moses approached by the Israelites asking to go back to Egypt? "Moses—how could you lead us out here to die? Wouldn't it be better to be back in Egypt where we had whatever we needed, even though we had to work relentlessly for an evil master?" (paraphrased) Even Moses was found saying similar things to God—why, Lord, did you lead us to this place? (paraphrased)

When under strain, humans have a tendency to default or long to default back to old ways, whether good or harmful, just to bring a sense of security. Security blankets feel good—they bring comfort and a sense of sentiment. And it makes perfect sense, because change is difficult—it pulls and pushes and bends and molds us. Change to something new is hard work.

Currently, our world is the blank canvas space of beginning new things. Whether we want it or not, the world is shifting to something new. Some have realized this fact and are beginning to take hold of the opportunity: for good or for ill.

The wilderness and exile provides the space to be honed into what is needed for this new thing that we cannot yet see. This space will require repentance, faithfulness, obedience, and patience. This is where God prepares leaders, servants, innovators, and voices crying out from the wilderness: make straight the paths—the kingdom of God is at hand! How are you and I allowing ourselves to be shaped, chiseled, molded for God's new thing?

# **DRIVE IN AND ONLINE WORSHIP**

- Drive in worship will be a no touch service.
- The service will be on a specific radio station, speaker system, and online. Bulletins will be available on the website by Friday evening for print or digital viewing.
- When you arrive, your car will be directed to a space. Once there, please remain in your cars.
- You can roll down your windows and open sun roofs. We encourage you to wear a mask to protect one another.
- Make sure to use the bathroom ahead of time—plan accordingly. The building is not open. The service will be no longer than 45 minutes.
- For offering, please be encouraged to mail it in or give digitally. If you would like to drop it off directly, there will be a no-contact, manned station by the sanctuary doors for those to drop their envelopes as you drive to your spot. The offering will be taken to the office once collected.
- For May 31—COMMUNION and PENTECOST Since this service includes everyone, Sunday will be communion, for those present and online. <u>Please bring your own bread and</u> juice to be used at the right time. Wear red.
