# **FROM YOUR PASTOR**

Patience has been often been mistaken as the synonym for passive.

In listening to a podcast this week, this phrase hit me like a ton of bricks. The statement pushed back at my frustration of the continued stay at home order. It gnarled its way into my discontent soul, tired of waiting for a date and time when all this can be done. I wrestled. I pined. I whined. I cried. Why?

I am not a patient person.

You can ask my parents who had to hide my Christmas presents at other people's houses. You can ask my husband who has rolled his eyes and told me to calm down more than a couple times to my nagging about information or getting things done. You can ask my children. You can ask the Board. Patience does not sit well with me.

This season of sheltering in has me stir-crazy, to be quite honest. God has done a fair share of rolling eyes at me as well. When will this be done, Lord? When can I see the people? Hug them? Reassure them face to face that God continues to embrace us in this crazy moment in time? Give me a date, God! (A word to the wise... do not demand too much of God—God tends to find intense ways to offer a response.)

So God's response: patience, but remember that does not mean passive.

I am reminded of all those who required patience in the scriptures: Noah (yeah, how many birds did he send out?), Abraham, Jacob, Joseph and his brothers, the Israelites in Egypt, Israelites in the wilderness, waiting for a king, living in exile, Jesus before starting ministry, disciples waiting for resurrection, for Christ's return and ascension, for the Holy Spirit, Paul... so on and so forth. Sometimes it was days—more often than not, years and years.

These times of required patience were transformative. There were still investments in hope to tend. There were still people to meet along the way to share the story of what was and what is promised. There were moments of growth and renewal and rededication. God finds the fields ready for turning over, cultivating, planting, and fertilizing.

Patience—it is not passive, but required for a new mindfulness of the way God is reworking hope. And not just to experience hope for ourselves, but to be harbingers of hope! This hope shines best in us and through us as cracked pots (2 Corinthians 4) - through our struggles, stresses, and strains. Things hoped for that we cannot see, but lean to in faith.

Lord—as we attempt patience in this continued state, help us to see what you are working anew around us, in us, and through us. Encourage us to open our eyes, unclog our ears, free our hands, and break our hearts to bear witness and participate in your hopeful glory!


