The current series, Living the Resurrection, moves us into the connective tissue of being one with living Christ Jesus and one with the body of Christ. For May 2, Jesus declares, "I am the vine. You are the branches." This past year, for me, has felt like the branches were more like runners-going every direction, making it hard to know which way to guide and nourish while moving forward in mission and ministry. My deepest hope and prayer was that each branch was tied snugly to the vine, still able to produce fruit. In other words, that you were wound so tight to Jesus that you entwined others as well, bearing the fruits of the Spirit, which we were reminded in the fall are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Sometimes, the fruit tasted sweet. I am guessing that, like me, sometimes the fruit tasted sour.

Tending to branches is hard work-both to do and for the branch to endure. As we are the branches to Jesus' vine, Jesus works on us to clear away bramble as well as prune both unhealthy and what we may deem healthy. This work requires us to be vulnerable and teachable, but also frees us to grow in healthier and larger ways that we would not have been able to do without the snips, trim, and clearing. As we grow, we then connect to other branches, inviting them to grow close to Christ and one to the other.

How is Christ working in and around you to help you grow in stronger and healthier ways? How is Jesus inviting you to be vulnerable to produce fruit that is sweet?

My most recent witness of Jesus drawing people to the vine was a couple Sundays after Easter. On Easter, we welcomed two new families to the nook of the vine that is Greensburg UMC. It was a joy and delight! Yet, it was two weeks after when I witnessed one of our new members not miss a step and welcome a visitor, both before and after service. This new member felt such a delight in being connected to this part of the vine, she wanted the visitor to feel the same. I marveled at her generosity of Spirit and willingness to connect. The further beauty of this act-it did not stop there. She made sure to connect with her the week after as well. Thank you for intentionally and lovingly extending that love and welcome to our guest!

Now, I will say, she was not the only one. There were others, as well, connecting and welcoming-and praise God! Thank you for your extension of hospitality and invitation. This is the first part of our vision and mission-to invite people to know Jesus Christ-to connect them to the vine so we may abide with Jesus and abide with one another. This happens both in and outside of the building.

How is God moving us into position so we can reach out and invite others to a place where we have come to know Jesus?


### STARTING MAY 2: DRIVE IN @ 9 AM & IN PERSON @ 11 AM
