Don't You Forget My Unicorn Job 39:9

October is a month filled with spooky fun and revelry. As we get ready for Halloween, people decorate their yards, watch their favorite scary movies, make costumes, and buy candy. In keeping with the spirit of the season, this month I will be preaching about monsters of the Bible. Our scriptures use fantastical beasts as symbols or parables to teach us moral lessons. I will explore some of these symbols like giants, dragons, and sea creatures. One beast receives an honorable mention: the unicorn.

Unicorns are not in the Bible – well not most Bibles. If you happen to have a copy of the King James translation at home, you can turn to Job 39:9-12 and read, "Will the unicorn be willing to serve thee, or abide by thy crib? Canst thou bind the unicorn with his band in the furrow? Or will he harrow the valleys after thee?" A distraught Job has confronted God about all the suffering he has endured. God reminds Job that the Lord's power and understanding surpasses human imagining. Job cannot command the wild animals, but God created them and could. What's up with the unicorn?

The Hebrew word used here is, "re'em." The truth is, we can't be certain what the ancient authors of this text meant. The Medieval scholars who translated the text didn't know either. From the context, we can tell it is clearly an animal. Human beings cannot normally command it. In theory, it could plow a field, but we wouldn't be able to make it. Presumably, the monks reached for the nearest bestiary and selected "unicorn," as their best guess. That translation informed the King James Bible and so millions of people still read the passage with the word, "unicorn."

Modern Hebrew scholars have a more likely theory. They think the word should be translated as wild ox or aurochs. The aurochs is a now extinct species of wild cow and the ancestor of domesticated cattle. So, God might be saying to Job, "can you command the wild ox?" It's an interesting species, but not exactly a monster of the Bible!

At the same time, the unicorn still offers us an important lesson. It's a reminder that our scriptures were written on another continent, thousands of years ago. They were written down, translated, and retranslated by people who had great faith but also the ability to make mistakes. Even the greatest modern Biblical scholars have points of disagreement and no two translations come out exactly the same. Our responsibility, as people of faith, is to engage meaningfully with scripture. We read it, research it, listen to experts, pray and maintain the humility that says we too might be wrong sometimes. Finding one, clear, undisputed, interpretation is a little like trying to hunt for a unicorn.

Fortunately, we don't have to look far to find what matters most. God is with us on our journey of faith. Christ died for us, the Holy Spirit is guiding us, and God's love never fails. If we pin our hopes to these landmarks, we won't get lost even as we wander through the wild and wondrous world of our scriptures.

I hope to see you in-person or online this month as I explore monsters of the Bible.

Bed Brigade News

We are excited to inform you that the Bed Brigade mission is going well. We completed our second build on August 27. We built 26 beds and 17 went to Crossroads UMC for distribution in Canton on September 6th and another 6 on September 8th to be distributed the same day. Also, as you may have heard, the University of Dayton offered us 100 mattresses. This provided us an opportunity and a challenge: the opportunity to serve an additional 100 families, the challenge of how to transport the mattresses from Dayton to Greensburg and where to store them. God responded!!! Freight Watch Logistics out of Mansfield offered to transport them and we can store them, at least temporarily, here in an unused room. Our next steps will include cleaning the mattresses (vacuum and disinfect), acquiring the additional bedding, and finding a time to build more frames. The church calendar is very busy for the next few months, so we are thinking of perhaps some time during the holiday break in early January.

We continue to seek out and contact families in need of beds. If you know of anyone or know of a contact who may help us identify potential recipients, please contact the church office, Judy Martin, or Dick Stratton. Thanks to all who have made this mission possible!!! If you are called to be a part of this exciting endeavor, please know that you will be welcome to share in our joy. None of this would be happening without God's intervention and individuals willing to listen and respond to His call.
