FINANCIAL GIVING ENVELOPES

Over the past few years the use of the standard contribution envelopes has changed for many in our congregation. While the pre-printed envelopes remain <u>very</u> important for the proper posting of your giving, some of you may already have a stock of unused envelopes even before the 2022 replenishment. After being mostly unable to meet in person during these Covid-19 years, some have changed their giving to once per month or have converted to the online giving option through Vanco or their own financial institution. We also have some additional stocks from previous years.

In order to decrease spending, the church will provide either "12 month only" stickers for self-application to those who wish to continue their contributions on a monthly basis. Or if you remain a weekly giver, we will happily supply the standard 52 week pre-printed envelopes. FAVORABLE TAX RULING FOR GUMC

As many of you may know, Summit County performed its six-year in-depth property re-evaluations in 2020. As a result, two of our parcels, primarily the wooded area behind the church, were reclassified from exempt to commercial, raising the taxes and fees on those parcels by about \$11,609 per year -- a significant amount. This is not uncommon with vacant land, and requires non-profits to make their case as to why land should be tax-free. We filed an appeal in March with the Board of Revision, stating that the parcels were used by the church and should remain exempt. Trustee Chair Brad Laterza and an attorney we retained presented our case Sept. 3 at a Board of Revision hearing. On Sept. 27, we received the Board ruling indicating that our appeal was successful.

During the appeals process, we continued to pay the annual property assessments that we had paid in the past, but did not pay the taxes that we believed to be inaccurate. As a result, the county's online tax records showed that we technically were delinquent. Now that these two parcels have been restored to exempt status, we expect that the classification of "delinquent" will disappear. We wanted to share this information with our church family to keep you apprised of this unusual situation.
