My friend, Rev. Jared Littleton, is a chaplain at a hospital in Cleveland. Recently, he participated in studies on patients' spirituality. They have patients of many different religions and of no religion, so spirituality can mean a lot of different things in that context. Jared shared with me that their working definition of spirituality is any place where a patient finds meaning, purpose, and connection. Humans seem to have an inherent need for each. Perhaps that is a piece of the Image of God in each one of us.

The church is a spiritual institution. When I heard that definition, I wondered how well we are helping people address those three fundamental needs? How are our experiences in this church helping us make meaning? Does our time in this faith community give us a sense of purpose? Are we finding the connections that sustain us? I have made those some of my guiding questions as I listen and learn more about this parish.

I was listening to some of our church leaders on the One Board, and it seemed they were asking the same questions. They celebrated the work of the discussion group that meets between worship services, and suggested that church members needed more places where they can wrestle with important questions and serve as a sounding board for one another. The One Board lifted the success of the Bed Brigade and expressed a hope that we can have more missional opportunities where members find a sense of purpose. One Board members celebrated the welcome reception the church offered for me and my family. It was a healing experience to dine together again, and they expressed their hope for more opportunities to restore our sense of community. In short, they celebrated the places where Greensburg United Methodist is making meaning, finding purpose, and sharing connection. They want to expand those opportunities, so they are accessible to all members and to people we meet in the community. So do I.

Several years ago, I went with a group of pastors on a tour of growing United Methodist Parishes in the North Coast District. We wanted to learn some best practices to share in our own ministry contexts. At Lorain Lighthouse UMC, Rev. Adam Davis, shared that their church asks every member to pick their, "three." Each member of the church attends one of their worship services, participates in a small group, and volunteers in one of the church's missional activities. Their parish was growing in numbers because its members were growing spiritually. They were addressing their needs for meaning, purpose and connection. My dream is to work with the One Board and you, the members of this church, to steadily increase opportunities in each of these three areas so, one day, we can make sure everyone here has their "three."

You'll see some of the new opportunities listed in this month's newsletter. Trust that more are on the way. If you are sensing a calling from God to lead in any of these areas, please let me or someone on One Board know. Perhaps, you know of an important community need and want to organize a group to address it. Maybe you are passionate about fellowship and want to organize Taco Tuesdays at Panchos! Listen to where the spirit is leading you, even if it is surprising. While this may seem like a new initiative, I like to think it has been brewing for some time. We are looking to make meaning, to find purpose, and to connect with others – that's not world's away from Love, Engage, Serve.
