## Worship Opportunities

"We are planning to do a combined service each month and I hope that each one will afford us these same opportunities: to celebrate our milestones, to strengthen our ties as a community, and to experiment with worship." Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire! (Hebrews 12:28-29)

I am writing this missive fresh off our combined Sunday service. We had the opportunity to celebrate our graduates, educators, and students at the start of a new year. We also had the opportunity to gather as one church body (87 strong) for worship. Finally, this Sunday gave us a chance to try out different forms of worship. We are planning to do a combined service each month and I hope that each one will afford us these same opportunities: to celebrate our milestones, to strengthen our ties as a community, and to experiment with worship.

The idea of sharing milestones came from the One Board's Char Borland. She noted that sometimes we welcome new members, celebrate baptisms, or honor volunteers at one service, and the folks worshipping at another time don't know about it. I hope to schedule these important events for combined services. As we saw with our education department last Sunday, God is doing exciting things at Greensburg UMC and we want to share it!

The second element came from our open house at the parsonage. As folks from the church gathered together for our reception, several celebrated reconnecting with old friends they hadn't seen in a while. As the church grows and changes, I think it is important to keep strong ties among the members. It is my hope that these combined services will give us more opportunities to be one body committed to faith and service.

The final element springs from my own experiences as a pastor and parent. I want to make sure our services offer the times and formats that best help us reach new people and welcome them into our faith community. I'm concerned that our most child-friendly service is not at the most child-friendly time. This may be making it harder to bring new young families into the parish. In other cases, some of our existing members are forced to choose between a time that is convenient and a style of worship that they find most convicting. I intend to use these combined services to experiment with our worship as I develop a vision for the future. My plan is to hold these combined worship services once a month through fall, winter, and spring. Next summer, we can take all that we have learned and formulate our plan.

Each of these elements will add life and vitality to this church, but I need your help! You can help by scheduling important milestones for our combined services. You can join me by striking up conversations with folks you either don't know or haven't seen in a while from the other service. You can also come to me with suggestions for what you'd like to try in worship. Do you have a background in music, dance, theater, art, graphic design, or another skill you'd like to share? Finally, you can offer your (patient and kind) constructive feedback on our experiment worship. What moved you? What didn't? How would you like to honor God? Together, we can shape an interactive and welcoming worship experience for years to come.

**Bed Brigade Update**— Dick and the team have been very busy this summer and wanted to share that they have distributed 118 beds to date. They currently have an inventory of 18 beds in preparation for the beginning of the school year. Along with the 18, they are hoping to build another 40 this month.

It was a STELLAR VBS— Wow what an amazing week we had shining Jesus' light! We had 63 kids join us along with 26 volunteers! Our Bible stories for the week focused on Jesus' birth, his ministry to Zacchaeus, Palm Sunday, his death and resurrection, and when Philip helped the Ethiopian. Through these lessons the kids learned that when life feels dark, when people don't get along, when good things happen, when people are sad, and when people need help we are to SHINE JESUS' LIGHT!! We collected school supplies that we gave to Green Good Neighbors to help as they fill backpacks for those in need. A great big THANK YOU to all of the amazing volunteers throughout the week from decorating, buying snacks, working registration,



crew leaders, station leaders, overflow help, and those I called up last minute... I could not have done this without you and I extremely appreciated all of the help and support!! # GREENSBURG UMC MONTHLY MISSION PROJECT-AUGUST

Our church's August Mission is supporting needy students in Green Schools beyond Blessings in a Backpack. Cherie McCortney, Family Support Specialist for Green, supplied this list of needed items and what their program does.

'As Family Support Specialists, our goal is to help alleviate the non-educational barriers to student success. Often that includes basic needs. We help with food, clothing and housing referrals, just to name a few. One thing I have learned is that even when a family has food and housing supports, basic hygiene items are not covered. Something as simple as a brush or shampoo often are difficult for families to obtain. I work with students from Pre-K through grade six. I started noticing that there were students who came to school and their basic morning hygiene routines had not been taken care of. We began our "Freshen' Up Zone" at Green Primary School. Students can come in and have a little help. They can have a cubby with a toothbrush, toothpaste and hair brush. We have some very talented staff who help with pretty braids. The kiddos start their day with a clean face, brushed teeth and freshly combed hair. This simple task has created a beautiful community among the children, it really makes a difference! I often send a little care package home with students so that they can have the supplies they need at home. I use the hygiene items in two ways. We share with families in need to use at home and we also use them in our Freshen' Up Zone. I am so thankful to you for your offer to help!"

Here are some items you can donate in the designated boxes outside the Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary: Shampoo, Conditioner, Bubble Bath, Body Wash, Detangling Hair Spray for kids, Bath Poufs, Bath Bombs, Deodorant, Laundry Detergent, Hair brushes, Paper towels, Toilet paper \*\*\* no toothpaste\*\*\* Many of these items are necessities and a few are fun. I often work to encourage little ones to bathe without a lot of encouragement at home. The bath bombs and poufs make bath time fun which helps everyone. I am so grateful for the help from your church family. Thank you again.
